NRPCA Receives \$1 Million in Funds from State of Michigan, Its Largest Gift Ever



Over the next several years, North Rosedale residents will see significant improvements at the Community House and surrounding park, thanks to a generous \$1-million allocation from the State of the Michigan. The news was announced as State Senator Mary Cavanagh presented a ceremonial check to North Rosedale Park Civic Association leaders at the Oct. 12 membership meeting. City Council President Pro Tem James Tate played an important role in securing the funds. When contacted by State legislators, he recommended NRPCA. Senator Cavanagh and State Representative Stephanie Young were instrumental in NRPCA receiving the funds. The funding will have a significant impact at the Community House.

Community Leaders Wanted for 2024 NRPCA Board

Are you interested in what goes on in the neighborhood and want to make North Rosedale a better community? Do you like meeting new people and working with a group to accomplish a goal? Would you like to work with others to make sure our community house and park are properly maintained? Then maybe it is time for you to get involved in the NRPCA board and help to keep this neighborhood strong and vibrant.

The NRPCA is accepting nominations to fill four seats on the 2024 board of directors and for vice president. Director positions are two-year terms, and the vice president serves a one-year term, typically followed by at least one year as president, then an additional year on the board as immediate past president.

To run for the NRPCA board, individuals:

- Must reside in North Rosedale Park
- Must be current on 2023 NRPCA dues at the time of application submission
- Must pay 2024 NRPCA dues before the election on January 12, 2024

Should include a digital photo of themselves in jpg format with their application

Applications must be returned by November 25 to James Martin at james@nrpca.org or William Frey at william.frey1@ gmail.com or to the NRPCA Community House office, 18445 Scarsdale. To download an application, go to https://www. nrpca.org/nominations.

After nominations are received, the Nominations Committee will compile a slate to present to the community. The slate will be finalized at the Dec. 14, 2023 general membership meeting, where nominations also may be made from the floor for any qualified candidate. All certified nominations are placed on the ballot, and all NRPCA resident and life members in good standing may vote at the NRPCA annual meeting Jan. 12, 2024. Members will be able to vote electronically or by paper ballots available in advance for members who cannot attend the meeting.

"After countless years of fundraising to maintain the Community House and grounds, we received this phenomenal gift from our State Legislature," said Eric Willingham, NRPCA President. "We are eternally grateful for these funds as they will spearhead many of the repairs and upgrades that we wish to have done! Many thanks to Council President Pro Tem James Tate for his foresight and understanding the needs of our organization."

Willingham added that the funds are designated for structural upgrades. "We still encourage our residents to pay their dues, which support day-to-day operations including lights, heat, water, lawn service, snow removal, etc." The list of improvements has not been finalized. Here are the proposed projects:

- Electrical upgrade
- Ballroom floor replacement/stage
- Garage roof and door replacement
- Window replacement
- Parking lot resurfacing
- Playground resurfacing
- Backup batteries for solar roofing
- Additional exterior lighting
- Stormwater solutions for flooding
- Media and video package
- Mezzanine and balcony upgrade
- Replacing flooring on stairs
- Beautification of flower beds
- Signage

North Rosedale Resident Tess Tchou Travels to the Philippines for Medical Mission

Tess Tchou joined 18 medical and non-medical professionals in September to provide a variety of health services for children and adults as part of a medical mission to Samar, a remote island in the Philippines.

The mission ran from Sept. 11-13 and involved performing health check-ups the first day for about 400 children and adults on Ginulgan, an isolated village. The next two days were spent at St. Scholastica's Hospital, built after a request by a Catholic bishop and run by the Benedictine sisters.

Nearly 300 residents lined up for medical exams and consultations. The medical mission allowed the hospital to identify residents needing care and inform them of possible free or adjusted-fee services through government funding and private donations.

Tchou (Shaftsbury) assisted by monitoring



lines and interpreting, running a food pantry, and providing oral hygiene instruction at an elementary school near the hospital. Tchou is no stranger to assisting others, having organized a number of health fairs at the Philippine American Community Center of Michigan.

Little Free Library Gets Spruced Up Thanks to Park Residents Elizabeth and Jeremy Cooper

After noticing the Little Free Library at the Community House needed repairs and some paint, former NRPCA board member Elizabeth Cooper (Edinborough) enlisted the help of her son, Jeremy, and got to work. First came a plexiglass door and then paint. Jeremy painted different designs on the sides, while Elizabeth painted the trim and added letters on the front. The library was installed in 2014.

Fred Russell Sr.



Former North Rosedale Park resident Frederick Russell Sr. passed away recently at age 96. A native of

Nebraska, Russell moved with his family to North Rosedale Park (Lancashire) in the mid-70s, one of the first African-American families in the subdivision. Russell made history in 1977 as the first African American to serve on the NRPCA board. He also served as a treasurer and had roles in a number of plays with the Park Players, the local acting troupe. He and his wife, Mary Lou, were life members of the NRPCA.

He spent his career working as a hospital administrator and held numerous accounting positions with the federal government. After steadily moving up the ladder, Russell retired as a branch chief with the Internal Revenue Service in 1999.

He is survived by his daughter, Rhea; his son and daughter-in-law, Fred Jr. and Dista; granddaughter, Tyler; twin grandsons, Cole and Collin; and a host of relatives and friends. His memorial service was held Oct. 21.

Alva Greene

Alva Greene, a North Rosedale resident (Gainsborough), recently passed at age 85. A native of Mississippi, Greene was educated in Mississippi schools and earned a bachelor's degree in home economics from Mississippi Valley State University. She later received a master's degree in family living and child development. Greene and her family relocated to Detroit in 1966, and she gained employment with the Detroit Public Schools as a home economics teacher. After 30 years of service, she retired in 2000 with her last assignment at Northwestern High School. She also was an active member of Hartford Memorial Baptist Church, faithfully visiting homebound and sick members and working in Vacation Bible School.

She is survived by her husband, Dr. Joe Greene; daughter, Leatrice Oakley; son, Joseph; two granddaughters, Breanne and True; and other relatives and friends.
