Community House Plaza Named after Marsha Bruhn September 17





The North Rosedale Park

Civic Association bestowed its highest honor as the plaza at the Community House was named after Marsha Bruhn in recognition of her work with the Legacy Project and in the community. The Marsha S. Bruhn Community Plaza was dedicated during a ceremony at the Community House on Sunday, Sept. 17 at 3 p.m., which was open to the public.

For more than a decade, Bruhn led the Legacy Project, a capital campaign to address structural issues at the Community House and to enhance the facility and the surrounding park. As a result of the work of Bruhn, the Legacy Project steering committee, and various subcommittees, with support from the City of Detroit, State of Michigan, philanthropic organizations, area companies and hundreds of neighbors and friends, an astounding \$1.9 million were raised.

In addition to her work with the capital campaign, Bruhn restarted the code enforcement committee, rehabbed three houses deteriorating on her block and initiated the Grandmont Rosedale Neighborhood Open House.

A native of Fremont, Ohio, Bruhn has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Denison University in Granville, Ohio and a master's degree in urban and regional planning from Virginia Tech University. She had an interest in planning early in her career. She joined the Detroit City Planning Commission in 1975, serving as its director from 1983 – 2005.

Her work with the Planning Commission was invaluable, giving Bruhn the foundation to prepare strong grant proposals. Of the 19 grant requests made to the City of Detroit, State of Michigan, Knight/Kresge/Davidson Foundations and others, 16 were approved, with Bruhn writing the majority.

"By the mid-2000s, declining property maintenance, vacant houses, and disinvestment were beginning to affect North Rosedale Park's quality of life and threaten its reputation as one of the most sought-after neighborhoods in Detroit. The crown jewel, our Community House, was showing its age," Bruhn said. "I felt called to do something about all of these and was fortunate that others shared my concerns."

While Bruhn played an important role in the effort, she is quick to point out that many others played integral roles. She credits Jim Johnson, the NRPCA Vice President when she was the Association President in 2011. Bruhn and Johnson shared a commitment to upgrading the Community House. To raise funds, the Association became a 501(C)3 organization, amending its by-laws and articles of incorporation with assistance from former resident John Burns of Clark Hill, who worked pro-bono. She also acknowledged the important role that Don Scheible played as the owner's representative.

The effort began in 2011 with visioning sessions led by U-D Mercy, followed by a feasibility study and fundraising plan developed with donations from neighborhood residents and the Boy Scouts. A steering committee was formed to lead the process. A fundraising manager was hired with grant funds from the Kresge Foundation.

Bruhn added, "Except for a one-year consultant and part-time project assistant, all work was done by volunteers. Over 200 current and former residents and friends participated on com-

mittees that led to the success of the capital campaign."

Help Maintain Neighborhood Standards

Here are a few reminders to help keep our neighborhood clean.

Solid Waste.

Follow the solid waste schedule: trash pickup every Monday; recycling, yard waste and bulk pickup every other Monday. Trash containers should be placed at the curb after 6 p.m. the night before and brought in by 9 a.m. the next day. (Ordinance 22-2-45)

Trash Container Storage.

Store your Courville container in the side or back yards. They cannot be stored at the curb, in the front yard or on the front porch. (Ordinance 22-2-43)

Yard Maintenance.

Keep your grass mowed and bushes trimmed. Rake and bag your leaves. Use paper, biodegradable bags only for yard waste. Plastic bags will not be collected. (Ordinance 9-1-104)

Keep your yard free of solid waste and/or rubbish to eliminate places for rodents to harbor. (Ordinance 22-2-88)

Noise.

Keep noise at a reasonable level. Be considerate of your neighbors when playing music or using a radio or other amplifying device. (Part IV, Chapter 16, Article 1)

Snow.

Shovel the snow on your front walk and sidewalk. City ordinance makes you responsible for clearing the snow from the public sidewalk in front of your home. (Ordinance 9-1-103)

Parking.

Avoid being fined by the City

- No parking of vehicles on lawns or other unpaved areas. (Ordinance 50-14-286)
- No storing of inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicles. (Ordinance 9-1-110)
- No parking of commercial vehicles in the neighborhood. (Ordinance 50-14-282)
- Failing to move a vehicle parked on the street for more than 48 hours. (Ordinance 50-8-27)

Auto Repair and Home-based Businesses.

Follow City ordinances for allowable home occupations. (Article XII, Division 5) Auto repair is not allowed. (Ordinance 50-8-27)

Dogs.

Be a responsible pet owner. Dogs must not be continuously tethered outside for more than 3 hours per day. Food, water, and shelter must be provided. (Part IV, Chapter 6, Article 2)

In addition, owners must clean up their dog's feces.

Basketball.

Playing games in streets, alleys and public places is prohibited. (Ordinance 43-1-10)
